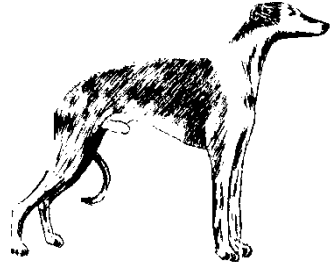
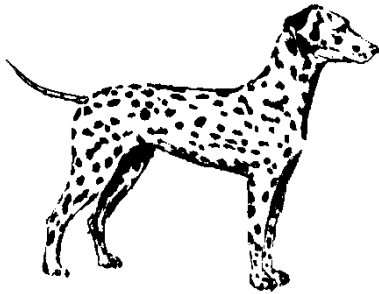
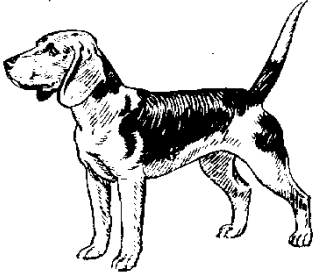
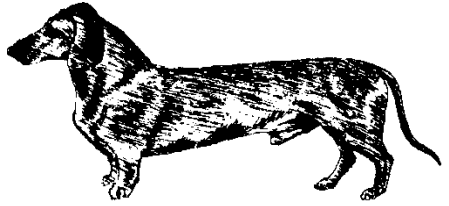
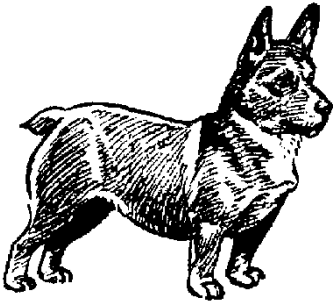






Pedigree Dogs [15]

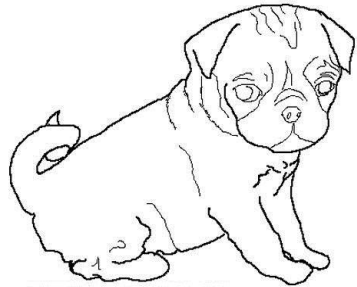
